What are the success, the difficulties and opportunities in the area of literacy and Non Formal Education? (Askthis question to all the actors abovementionned.)

summary of sucesses, difficulties and opportunities gathered from the actors mentioned above are as follow :

Successes:

- Establishment of short term Literacy program the 15 counties of Liberia.
- Development of standard for all NFE programs
- Development of Literacy curriculum for zero literate learners
- Establishment of local structures (Literacy management committees (LMC) in 14 counties)
- Training of Literacy facilitators and LMCs

Difficulties:

- No budgetary allocation for NFE in the national budget as a result almost all NFE programs are short terms and donor driven.
- Limited monitoring from the MOE due to lack of logistics for ABE staffs
- Lack of synergy among partners in NFE in Liberia which results in the lack of data
- Inadequate awareness among the illiterate population in Liberia especially in the rural communities on the importance of Non formal/alternative Basic education, the roles and responsibilities of adults and the local and national government.
- Government considers NFE paramount over non formal education/literacy.
- There are limited scholarship opportunities provided by national government to encourage adult literacy practitioners to enroll at institutions of higher learning in foreign countries to revamp or advance the adult education division at the Ministry of Education and to establish a division of adult Education at the State owned University (University of Liberia). There are no state own centers constructed in the counties and Districts exclusively for the purpose of adult education/literacy

Why it is true that non Governmental organizations and faith based groups are currently implementing adult literacy/educational programs, there is a likelihood of the process not being sustainable when the human resource capacity is not developed to enhance the process after donor funding elapses.

Opportunities

- PEACE : The absance of war in the country
- Willingness of illiterate adults and out of school youths to participate in the NFE programs
- Presence of NGOs/faith based organization and their willingness to support literacy/NFE programs
- Availability of policy document the supports the implementation of NFE program
